Soft skills, also called non-technical skills, reflect the interpersonal (e.g. communication, teamwork, and leadership) and cognitive skills (i.e. decision-making and situational awareness), that complement technical skills.

Failures in teamwork and non-technical skills have been implicated in adverse events and drawbacks of professionals and teams involved in many human activities.
